FEATURING KAY KOTAN AND REV. OLU BROWN.

KAY KOTAN will teach around her recent work, *Impact: Reclaiming the Role of Lay Ministry*. Her evening breakout session will focus on the critical work of leadership development and the process of launching leaders. **REV. OLU BROWN** will guide the group through his work, 4D Impact, considering four aspects of vital, healthy churches in 21st century ministry. His evening breakout session will consider practical applications of Moses' story for leadership.



KAY KOTAN is a credentialed coach, church consultant, speaker and author. She serves as the Director of the Center for Equipping Vital Congregations for the Susquehanna Conference of The United Methodist Church. She is an incredibly prolific author. Recent books include *Gear Up, Impact*, and her co-authored books *Renovate or Die, Get Their Name, 10 Prescriptions for a Healthy Church* and many others.

REV. OLU BROWN serves Impact Church in Atlanta, Georgia as the Lead Pastor. In January 2007, he peered through the windows of Brown Middle School Auditorium and saw the perfect beginning of his vision for a multicultural gathering of people who would be committed to sharing the love of Christ with the world. By 2008, Impact welcomed 1,000 worshipers at Impact Church each week. In December 2009, Impact constituted as a United Methodist Church and added two new worship experiences in 2012. In 2014, Impact Church renewed its vision and purchased and redeveloped a 76,000 squarefoot warehouse and 10 acres of land for a new multi-use worship and ministry center. Phase I opened May 2014. In 2016, Impact Church was listed as number 56 out 100 fastest growing churches in America. Brown is committed to doing church differently.
